## NURSE CORPS LOAN REPAYMENT AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS FISCAL YEAR 2021

### **Executive Summary**

The Nurse Corps Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs Report to Congress for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 responds to section 846(h) of the Public Health Service Act, which states, in part:

Not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of the Nurse Reinvestment Act, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section.

The goal of many Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) programs is to support the delivery of health care in areas of greatest need. HRSA administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution of nurses. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP support nursing education and training by providing recruitment and retention incentives to nurses committed to a career in underserved communities. These incentives include either a loan repayment or a scholarship award in exchange for service as a nurse at an eligible health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses (Critical Shortage Facility or CSF) that is located in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), or a loan repayment award for service as nurse faculty at an eligible accredited school of nursing.

In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps received \$88.1 million from annual appropriations and \$200 million from the American Rescue Plan Act (Public Law 117-2) funding. The Nurse Corps LRP received 5,756 new and continuation applications and the SP received 2,199 new and continuation applications. HRSA made 2,131 new and continuation Nurse Corps awards (1,587 LRP, including 175 Nurse Faculty LRP, and 544 SP) to nurses and nursing students across a total of 49 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Of the 1,587 new and continuing Nurse Corps LRP awards, HRSA made 1,412 awards to nursing participants serving at CSFs. Ninety-seven percent of those awards were at CSFs in high-need HPSAs (areas with a HPSA score of 14 or higher). The average HPSA score for the FY 2021 CSF placements was approximately 17. HRSA made 136 new and 39 continuation Nurse Corps LRP awards to nurse faculty participants – 50 percent of whom are serving at schools of nursing with at least a 50 percent enrollment of students from disadvantaged backgrounds. HRSA made 529 new and 15 continuation Nurse Corps SP awards to nursing students – 100 percent of whom met the expected family contribution eligibility of having the greatest financial need.

As of September 30, 2021, the Nurse Corps field strength included 2,521 registered nurses and nurse faculty members fulfilling multi-year service commitments – representing the program's highest field strength ever. Further, based on data collected by HRSA, 88 percent of Nurse Corps alumni remained at a CSF for up to 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment.

### I. Statutory Language

Section 846(h) of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act requires that the Secretary provide a report to Congress. The PHS Act states, in part:

Not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of the Nurse Reinvestment Act, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section.

#### II. Introduction

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution of nursing graduates and professionals.

The Nurse Corps LRP is a financial incentive program in which registered nurses (RN) and advanced practice registered nurses (APRN), such as nurse practitioners (NP), enter into a contract with the federal government to work full-time in a Critical Shortage Facility (CSF) with a critical shortage of nurses.<sup>3</sup> The LRP repays 60 percent of the outstanding principal and interest on the nursing education loans for participants with the greatest financial need in exchange for a 2-year service commitment. Participants may be eligible for an additional 25 percent repayment in exchange for an optional third year of full-time service.

The Nurse Corps LRP also makes awards to nurses to serve as faculty at accredited schools of nursing. HRSA provides the same loan repayment benefits to nurse faculty as program participants serving at a CSF. The awards aid in the recruitment and retention of nurse faculty by decreasing economic barriers associated with pursuing a career in academia. Higher compensation in clinical and private sector settings is luring current and potential nurse educators from teaching.<sup>4</sup> The average ages of doctoral and master's degree-prepared nurse faculty are 57 years and 54 years, respectively.<sup>5</sup> The American Association of Colleges of Nursing expects the shortage of nurse faculty to increase as current nurse faculty retire.<sup>6</sup>

The Nurse Corps SP pays tuition, fees, and other reasonable costs, and pays a monthly stipend to individuals attending accredited schools of nursing in exchange for a service commitment of at least 2 years in a CSF after graduation. The Nurse Corps SP reduces financial barriers to nursing education for all levels of professional nursing students, increasing the pipeline of nurses who

serve in CSFs. Qualified applicants who have the greatest financial need<sup>7</sup> receive a funding preference. HRSA pays tuition and fees directly to the schools, while stipends are paid monthly to the students to assist with the cost of books, clinical supplies/instruments, and uniforms. Stipends were \$1,527.55 per month in fiscal year (FY) 2021. Each participant was eligible to receive \$18,330.60 in yearly stipend support.

The Nurse Corps LRP and SP work together to address the distribution of nurses across the United States through the placement of nurses in CSFs. Many factors affect the supply of and demand for nurses including population growth, aging of the general population and of the nursing workforce, overall economic conditions, demand for health services broadly and within specific health care settings, and health care reimbursement. A 2017 study by the National Center for Health Workforce Analysis projected less growth in the RN supply relative to demand in seven states that could result in regional shortages by 2030. Employers in some parts of the country report difficulty in recruiting and retaining an adequate number of RNs because of an aging RN workforce and a lack of younger RNs to fill the positions. The age structure of the nursing workforce differs by geographic regions and suggests that supply and demand of RN projections and potential intervention also differ.

#### III. Overview

HRSA establishes and publishes Nurse Corps program priorities annually in the Application and Program Guidance for each program. In FY 2021, 50 percent of the Nurse Corps LRP and SP total annual appropriations was set aside to support NPs. Of the 50 percent allocated for NPs, up to 20 percent of that allocation was available for psychiatric NPs and the remaining 30 percent was available to all other NPs. To increase the number of NPs participating in the programs, the Nurse Corps LRP and SP actively recruited licensed NPs and individuals interested in pursuing training as an NP through outreach efforts to colleges, universities, and associations.

Additionally, for the FY 2021 Nurse Corps LRP and SP application cycle, both programs established set-aside funding of up to \$5 million to support women's health for applicants working in one of the following capacities: women's health NP, certified nurse midwife, or certified obstetrics-gynecology (OB/GYN) RN.

For the Nurse Corps LRP, applicants with the greatest financial need and who work in CSFs located in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) with scores of 14 or above receive

funding preference. 12 For the Nurse Corps Faculty LRP, applicants teaching at schools where at least 50 percent of the student body is from a disadvantaged background receive funding preference.

The Nurse Corps SP considers applicants with the greatest financial need, based on the applicant's expected family contribution as determined by the U.S. Department of Education, to receive a funding preference. For FY 2021, this preference included an expected family contribution between \$0 and \$6,345. Among qualified applicants with the greatest financial need, HRSA makes awards based on consideration of:

- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited diploma or undergraduate and graduate nursing program or an accredited graduate-level NP program, including NPs specializing in psychiatric mental health, with full-time or part-time registration for consecutive terms.
- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited Doctor of Nursing Practice program, a program for certified nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse specialists, or psychology specialist, with full-time registration for consecutive terms.

This report summarizes the activities of the Nurse Corps LRP and SP for FY 2021 and provides information on:

- Number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;
- Number of graduates;
- Amount of scholarship and loan repayments made;
- Educational institution attended;
- Number and placement location of Nurse Corps LRP and SP recipients at CSFs;
- Default rate and actions required;
- Amount of outstanding default funds for both the Nurse Corps LRP and SP;
- Reason for default, to the extent that it can be determined;
- Demographics of the individuals taking part in the Nurse Corps LRP and SP;
- Justification for the allocation of funds between Nurse Corps LRP and SP; and
- Evaluation of the costs and benefits of the programs.

## IV. Report Requirements

# Requirement #1: The Number of Enrollees, Scholarships, Loan Repayments, and Grant Recipients

In addition to awards made with annual appropriations (base funds) and American Rescue Plan Act funds, Nurse Corps made new and continuation Nurse Corps LRP and SP awards with funds recovered from awardees who breached their contracts. Section 846(g)(4) of the PHS Act authorizes that the amounts recovered from participants who breach their contracts are to be available for reaward and remain available until expended. The programs use the recovered

funds to make new awards, continuations, and modifications to the existing contracts. If a Nurse Corps SP participant agrees to a contract for less than the full duration of the degree program (e.g., a scholarship covering only the first 2 years of a 4-year bachelor's degree program), the participant may request a continuation of the contract in return for a commitment for additional years of support. Nurse Corps LRP participants are eligible for an additional 25 percent of their original verified qualifying outstanding student loan debt in exchange for an additional year of service. Participants requesting continuations must be in good standing with the terms of the initial contract. The programs fund eligible continuations before funding new awards. In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps LRP added \$290,785.91 to its no-year account and made five new awards. The Nurse Corps SP did not fund any new awards using no-year account funds.

#### **Nurse Corps Field Strength**

Information related to the total number of nurses employed at an approved site are tracked using the HRSA Bureau of Health Workforce Field Strength Dashboard. Currently, there are over 2,500 Nurse Corps participants serving at approximately 1,766 sites. Nurse Corps participants provide care to 3.3 million patients annually in urban, rural, and tribal areas. About 29 percent of Nurse Corps clinicians work at a Federally Qualified Health Center or Look-Alike. <sup>14</sup>

Due to the addition of \$200 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding, FY 2021 represented the Nurse Corps' highest field strength in the history of the programs. HRSA made 1,587 Nurse Corps LRP awards, including 1,246 new awards, 341 continuation awards from annual appropriations, as well as 5 new awards from recovered funds (Table 1). The 1,587 awards were to RNs (462 awards; 29 percent), NPs (801 awards; 50 percent), certified registered nurse anesthetists (81 awards; 5 percent), certified nurse midwives (66 awards; 4 percent), clinical nurse specialists (2 awards; 0.13 percent), and nurse faculty (175 awards; 11 percent). <sup>15</sup>

HRSA made 544 Nurse Corps SP awards, including 529 new and 15 continuation awards from annual appropriations. HRSA did not make any new Nurse Corps SP awards with no-year funds (Table 2). The 544 awards were to associate degree students (58 awards; 11 percent), bachelor's degree students (220 awards; 40 percent), bachelor's accelerated students (173 awards; 32 percent), master's degree students (60 awards; 11 percent), doctor of nursing practice (31 awards; 5.7 percent), and nursing diploma students (2 awards; 0.37 percent). <sup>16</sup>

#### **Requirement #2: The Number of Graduates**

Nurse Corps SP participants may enroll in diploma programs as well as accredited associate, bachelor's, and master's degree programs. The minimum service requirement is 2 years, with a maximum of 4 years of full-time service, in a CSF depending on the number of years of academic support. Participants can choose from 1 to 4 years of scholarship support, consisting of payments for tuition and fees, other reasonable costs, and a monthly stipend.

Nurse Corps SP participants may work part-time to fulfill their service obligation. However, HRSA will extend the service obligation years of service so that the aggregate amount of service performed is equivalent to the full-time option. Nurse Corps SP graduates have up to 9 months from the date of graduation to obtain a nursing license, accept an offer of employment from a program-approved facility, and begin full-time or part-time clinical services at a CSF. The total of active Nurse Corps SP participants who graduated in FY 2020 is 239. Of those participants, 63 were serving in a CSF and 176 were waiting for placement at a CSF. In FY 2021, 88 percent of Nurse Corps alumni remained at a CSF for up to 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment.

# Requirement #3: The Amount of Scholarship Payments and Loan Repayments Made

Table 3 below contains amounts paid for Nurse Corps LRP and SP new awards and continuations, funded from annual appropriations (base funds), American Rescue Plan Act funds, and no-year funds.

### Requirement #4: The Educational Institutions Attended by Recipients<sup>17</sup>

Nurse Corps SP participants attended 353 schools in 46 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Virgin Islands (these numbers include all Nurse Corps scholars awarded in the prior FY). Appendix B illustrates the distribution of FY 2021 new awards by state and educational institution.

# Requirement #5: The Number and Placement Location of the Scholarship and Loan Repayment Recipients at Healthcare Facilities with a Critical Shortage of Nurses

Except for nurse faculty, all Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants are required to serve at a CSF. The following types of facilities are eligible CSFs for placement of Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants:

In FY 2021, 1,412 new Nurse Corps LRP participants served in 1,035 CSFs in 47 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Virgin Islands (Appendix C); 175 newly-awarded nurse faculty participants served in 155 schools of nursing in 43 states (Appendix D). In FY 2021, 63 Nurse Corps SP participants served in 61 CSFs in 29 states and the District of Columbia (Appendix A).

#### **Requirement #6: Default Rate and Actions Required**

HRSA expresses the Nurse Corps LRP and SP default rates as the percentage of participants in a cohort (all participants with a new or continuation contract awarded in a FY) who default (number of participants who have defaulted divided by the total number of individuals in the cohort). Individuals often participate for multiple years; however, HRSA calculates default rates in the FY in which an individual received the initial award. Therefore, for any given cohort, the default rate for a FY may change over time. When participants are out of compliance with their service obligation, they are referred to HRSA's Division of Participant Support and Compliance for compliance assistance. If the participant does not come into compliance and defaults, Division of Participant Support and Compliance refers the participant to the Program Support Center for debt collection.

The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps SP is 8 years – 4 years in school and 4 years of obligated service. The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps LRP is 3 years – 2 years of service under an initial contract and 1 optional year of service under a continuation. Participants with periods of approved suspension of service may require an additional 1 to 2 years of monitoring. Participants in the Nurse Corps SP wishing to serve part-time must obtain prior approval from Nurse Corps SP and must extend the service obligation to equal the full-time commitment. Thus, HRSA reports default rates over 10 years for the Nurse Corps SP and 5 years for the Nurse Corps LRP to provide an accurate picture of default rates. Historically, few to no defaults occur within the first year of the service obligation.

Participants who breach their contracts are placed in default and are liable to repay the Nurse Corps LRP or SP funds they received, plus interest, from the date of the default, which is defined as the date the participant breached the Nurse Corps contract service obligation or, for scholars still in school, the date they left their educational program as described in section 846(g)(1)(A) of the PHS Act. Participants must pay the total amount owed, including interest, within 3 years of the date of default. The interest rate is the maximum legal prevailing rate for the applicable quarter determined and fixed by the Secretary of the Treasury after taking into consideration private consumer rates of interest. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP work with participants placed in default by helping them to satisfy their debts through service when possible. In FY 2021, HRSA granted 12 participants previously in default an opportunity to return to service. Of those 12 participants, five participants were from the Nurse Corps LRP and seven participants were from the Nurse Corps SP.

As of September 30, 2021, there were 169 defaults in the Nurse Corps SP from FY 2011 to FY 2021.

# Requirement #7: Amount of Outstanding Default Funds of Both the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Section 846(g)(4) of the PHS Act authorizes amounts recovered from participants who breach their Nurse Corps LRP or SP contract to be made available for the respective program until expended. HRSA uses these funds for new awards, continuations, and modifications to existing contracts. In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps LRP added \$290,786 to its no-year account providing five new awards and closed the FY with a net no-year amount of \$447. In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps SP added \$478,252 to its no-year account and closed the FY with a net amount of \$623,307.

As of September 30, 2021, the total outstanding default debt was \$2,963,959 for the Nurse Corps LRP and \$14,493,690 for the Nurse Corps SP.

#### **Requirement #8: The Reasons for the Default**

The most common reasons for default in the Nurse Corps SP are that participants fail to complete their service obligation (52 percent), receive an academic dismissal (17 percent), or withdraw from school (16 percent).

The most common reason for default in the Nurse Corps LRP is a failure to complete the service obligation subsequent to a participant's resignation from an approved site (61 percent).

# Requirement #9: The Demographics of the Individuals Participating in the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants self-report demographic data. Of the participants who reported on sex, race, and ethnicity, the most commonly reported sex was female and ethnicity was white. Black or African-American was the largest reported minority group demographic (Table 8). HRSA requests Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino ethnicity data in the electronic application separately from sex and race data. Applicants may choose to report on any of these demographic areas in whole or in part. As a result, Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino data may be over-reported as this information is the only metric for capturing ethnicity.

# Requirement #10: Justification for the Allocation of Funds between the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Historically, HRSA allocated total Nurse Corps funds at 67 to 75 percent for the LRP and 33 to 25 percent for the SP. In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps programs received \$88.1 million in annual appropriations and \$200 million from the American Rescue Plan Act for a total of \$288.1 million. Of the \$88.1 million in annual appropriations, HRSA allocated \$75.4 million for the Nurse Corps LRP and SP awards, consisting of \$51.6 million for LRP awards and \$23.8 million for SP awards. The remaining \$12.7 million directly supported the Nurse Corps programs in the form of staffing and acquisition contracts, including the electronic system used to process program applications and monitor awarded participants, tax withholding and reporting, and other administrative obligations. With additional American Rescue Plan Act funding in FY 2021, the Nurse Corps programs supported the nation's COVID-19 emergency response. In FY 2022, Nurse Corps plans to fully expend remaining supplemental funds. Both Nurse Corps LRP and SP support efforts to meet nurse workforce needs such as creating a pipeline and placing nurses in the field.

# Requirement #11: An Evaluation of the Overall Costs and Benefits of the Programs

Analysis of costs per years of service:

#### 1. FY 2021 Nurse Corps LRP Awards

In FY 2021, HRSA made 1,587 new awards, an increase of 241.3 percent compared to the 465 new awards in FY 2020. This change was due to an increase in Nurse Corps LRP awards in FY 2021 supported by the addition of the American Rescue Plan Act funding. The average new award amount for Nurse Corps LRP participants was \$74,870 for non-faculty and \$75,099 for nurse faculty. This is a 14 percent decrease in the average new award amount for non-faculty participants and a 20 percent decrease in the average new award amount for nurse faculty participants from FY 2020 to 2021.

#### Nurse Corps LRP Continuations

In FY 2021, 53 percent of the participants initially awarded in FY 2019 requested a continuation award. The Nurse Corps LRP awarded 341 continuations in FY 2021. Nurse faculty received 11 percent (39) of the continuation awards.

To continue support of APRNs in women's health (women's health NPs and certified nurse midwives) and certified OB/GYN RNs working in eligible CSFs, the Nurse Corps LRP increased its women's health set-aside to \$5 million, compared to FY 2020 funding of \$750,000. Nurse Corps LRP made 83 awards to support Women's Health from annual appropriations and an additional 65 awards from American Rescue Plan Act funding. In FY 2020, the Nurse Corps LRP made six awards.

#### 2. FY 2021 Nurse Corps SP Awards

In FY 2021, the Nurse Corps SP made 529 new awards and 15 continuation awards. The average new award was \$102,718.52 – a 117 percent increase in the number of new awards and a 3 percent decrease in the average new award amount from FY 2020 to FY 2021. To increase the supply of RNs with the ability to respond to the growing nursing shortage and other public health crises such as a global pandemic, the Nurse Corps SP dedicated funding to create a career pathway to obtaining a qualifying degree to become an RN. Students with multiple career designations of entry include health professionals such as Certified Nursing Assistants, Home Health Aides, Medical Assistants, Licensed Practical (Vocational) Nurses, and other entry-level health professionals. Nurse Corps SP made 45 awards to eligible scholars from the career pathway set-aside.

#### 3. Average Amount Funded per Year of Service Obligated

HRSA bases new Nurse Corps LRP awards on 2 years of obligated service and caps them at 60 percent of the applicant's total eligible loan amounts. The average new LRP award amount per year of obligated service was \$37,435 for nurses serving in CSFs and \$37,550 for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing – a 14 percent decrease and a 20 percent increase respectively from FY 2020 to FY 2021. <sup>23</sup>

HRSA bases Nurse Corps SP awards on 1 year of service for each year of funding with a minimum of 2 years of service. The average new SP award amount per year of obligated service was \$47,031 – a 6 percent decrease from FY 2020 to FY 2021.

#### V. Conclusion

FY 2021 represented the Nurse Corps' highest field strength in the history of the program due to the additional American Rescue Plan Act funding. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP continue to work towards increasing the number of nurses working in CSFs and teaching in nursing schools across the United States. In FY 2022, the Nurse Corps programs will continue their focus on ensuring Nurse Corps participants are serving in areas with the greatest need. Some of the critical activities of the Nurse Corps programs in FY 2021 were to increase the number of advanced practice nurses trained in psychiatric mental health and to increase the number of women's health NPs, certified nurse midwives, and certified OB/GYN RNs. The ongoing participation of nurse faculty in the LRP program will also help address upcoming nurse shortages in the future. Through the efforts and accomplishments highlighted in this report, dedicated RNs and APRNs can care for underserved populations in CSFs and provide quality education in schools of nursing with students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
